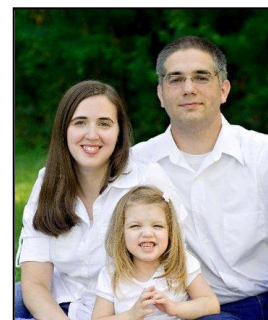

Director of Missions

Becoming the Director of Missions of the Sweetwater Baptist Association has quickly become a gratifying and adventurous commitment of faith.



You have placed upon me a great honor. The privilege of leading our association to new mission opportunities and fulfilling the Great Commission births a new zeal for taking Jesus' words to heart. He commanded us in Matthew 28:19-20 to **"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: ²⁰Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world."** These words are not meant to be a suggestion, but rather a command. They are not up for debate. We are to be soldiers in God's army waiting for instructions. We are not to question His orders: we are simply to be obedient.

Upon answering this call of service, God placed a burden upon my heart to see revival break forth in our community. He brought to my mind the days of Simultaneous Revivals. Prayerfully seeking God's approval, I am challenging all congregations to seek renewal from the Lord. During the month of April, 2012 plan to receive God's blessings pour down like the Spirit descending on the day of Pentecost. Our cities and towns need to see heaven break open. That is only going to happen through His church. Will you commit to have revival?

A season of prayer must precede the expectation of revival. As Joshua led the children of Israel to victory at Jericho, a path of triumph had to be followed. Seven days of obedience led to the breaking down of the walls. Following that example, barriers that threaten to restrict us from enjoying God's blessings must be met with the same type of dedication. We need to seek the Holy Spirit's direction in discovering target areas in our communities to bathe in prayer, and allow Him to lead us in the outreach of our neighbors. Surely, God will bless our efforts as we present Him our willing hearts.

As you are reading this, a team representing our association is traveling to Haiti to study the work that is presently on-going in Port-au-Prince. As you know, we support an orphanage with 32 children there. They are requesting aid in building a school for those and other children in the immediate area. A report on these findings should be given on Monday night at our Annual Meeting in October.

I look forward to a long and productive relationship with the churches of our association. Thus far, I have enjoyed visiting, preaching and worshiping with our church families. Today more than ever, I believe that we are "churches working together sharing Jesus."

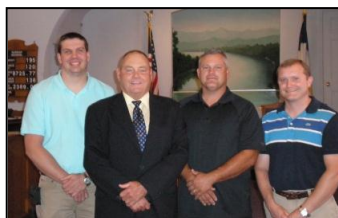
ROCKY SPRINGS BAPTIST CHURCH:

CHESTUA BAPTIST CHURCH:

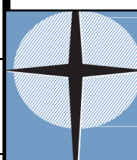

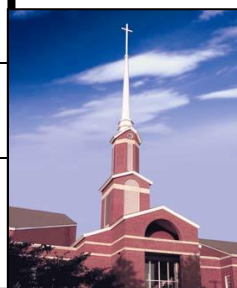
